ADA announces new policy to combat opioid epidemic

ADA has announced policy urging mandated prescription limits and continuing education. The policy supports:

- mandatory continuing education in prescribing opioids and other controlled substances.
- statutory limits on opioid dosage and duration of no more than seven days for the treatment of acute pain, consistent with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention evidence-based guidelines.
- dentists registering with and utilizing Prescription Drug Monitoring Programs (PDMPs) to promote the appropriate use of opioids and deter misuse and abuse.

Most opioids prescribed to patients in the U.S. are written by physicians and other medical professionals for

management of chronic (long-term) pain. Dentists with an appropriate license may also prescribe opioids, and do so most often for management of acute (short-term) pain such

ADA policy recommends opioid prescribing and continuing education mandates

as severe tooth decay, extraction of teeth and root canals. In 1998, dentists were the top specialty prescribers of opioid pain relievers, accounting for 15.5 percent of all opioid prescriptions in the U.S. By 2012, this number had fallen to 6.4 percent.

New data published in the April issue of *The Journal of the American Dental Association* (JADA) continue to shed light on opioid prescriptions from a dental perspective:

- Benefits and Harms Associated with Analgesic Medications Used in the Management of Acute Dental Pain: Authors concluded non-steroidal antiinflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) such as ibuprofen and acetaminophen are equal or superior to using opioids for dental pain. The findings support ADA policy that dentists "consider [NSAIDs] as the first-line therapy for acute pain management."
- Opioid Prescribing Practices from 2010 through 2015 Among Dentists in the United States: Findings indicate that patients who received an opioid prescription from a dentist were given a median supply to last three days. Across all age groups over a six-year period, opioid prescriptions increased by 17 per 1,000 dental patients. The largest increase in opioid prescriptions was among patients aged 11 to 18; and 11-18 and 19-25 age groups received a higher median dose than all other age groups.
- *Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP) Data:* Authors provided 10 clinical scenarios dental prescribers might encounter and how to assess the PMP data from a clinical, risk assessment and law enforcement perspective.

Get to know the community health clinics in your areas

Community Health Dental Clinics are found scattered throughout our state of Montana. In fact, there are 17 health centers with over 60 sites in Montana and all provide oral health care. Eleven of those Community Health Centers in our state have on site dental clinics and the others offer care via referral agreements. Many dentists know they exist, but aspects of the Community Health Center (CHC) are still unknown to us.

It is important to know that each CHC is unique. Reaching out to develop a relationship with the Community Health Centers in your area is the best way to learn more about the CHC, the services they provide, and how to work with or refer to them. CHC's should be thought of as additional resource for patients in our communities. There are times that patients simply cannot afford dental work but need dental care. CHC's all offer a sliding fee discount for patients due to the nature of their Mission.

One similarity among all Community Health Centers is the primary care mission to improve the health of the nation's undeserved communities and vulnerable populations by assuring access to comprehensive, culturally competent, and quality primary care services. HRSA (Health Resources and Service Administration) introduced its first reportable measurement for dental in 2015. The UDS measurement captures the percentage of children age 6-9 year at moderate or high risk who receive dental sealants on their first permanent molar. This UDS measure also helps us work toward the Healthy People 2020 goals to reduce the portion of children and adolescents who experience dental caries on permanent teeth. Community Health Dental Clinics are focusing on prevention to help increase the overall oral health of our nation.

percent of dentists and 40.4% of physicians licensed in Montana are registered with the MPDR, compared to pharmacists (74.7%), physician's assistants (61.7%), and nurse practitioners (58.7%).


Board of Dentistry says "no thanks" to denturist scope legislation

At its March 10 meeting, the Montana Board of Dentistry declined a request by the Denturist Association of Montana to sponsor its proposed 2019 legislation that would expand the scope of denturitry. DAM's bill would allow denturists to perform "any of the practices included in the curricula" of a denturitry education program recognized by the board. MDA opposes this legislation, as it would open the door for denturists to place dentures over implants or other procedures currently not allowed to them under the board's rules. In 2014, the dental board was sued by DAM to overturn its implant rule. The First District Court and the Montana Supreme Court ruled against DAM, however the Supreme Court returned the case to district court for consideration of Montana's recent legislation regarding restraint of trade. In a separate action, the Commissioner of the Department of Labor and Industry in December 2017 upheld the current

board rule as a necessary restraint of trade to protect public health and safety.

The dental board also voted not to approve a request of the Community Health Center Clinic in Great Falls to allow Limited Access Permit (LAP) hygienists to practice in all Great Falls schools. Board members found that the CHCC could provide dental screenings and case management to children without the need for schools to be designated as LAP sites. Board members expressed concerns about LAP hygienists taking radiographs without prior authorization of a dentist. Dr. Mari Kiesling, a Helena pediatric dentist, and Dr. Jane Gillette testified against the proposal, as it creates a potential overexposure of children to radiation.

Following the meeting, Dr. Aimee Ameline was appointed by Gov. Bullock to her third five-year term on the board.



General Assembly to vote on officers and amendments to MDA Constitution and Bylaws

The MDA General Assembly will meet on Thursday, May 3 at 11:45 a.m. at the Hilton Garden Inn in Missoula to elect 2018-19 officers and consider amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws. All MDA members are entitled to attend and vote. The Assembly will follow the President's Luncheon.

Nominations forwarded by the Board for officers are: President - Dr. Andrew C. Althauser (Missoula) President-Elect - Dr. Ronald C. Jarvis (Kalispell) Vice President - Dr. Jason A. Tanguay (Bozeman) Secretary-Treasurer - Dr. Douglas S. Hadnot (Lolo) First Alternate Delegate - Dr. Kurt S. Lindemann (Kalispell)

Nominations may also be made from the floor of the Assembly.

The complete text of proposed amendments is posted to MDA's website: www.MontanaDental.org. Here is a summary:

Resolution 1-2018 – Clarifies the nomenclature for committees to include Standing and Special committees.

Resolution 2-2018 – Requires the Executive Director to submit names of Delegates and Alternate Delegates to the ADA for credentialing.



Resolution 3-2018 – Clarifies provisions for life, retired, service, honorary, student and associate membership; adds a new category of Provisional Membership and aligns MDA's Bylaws with ADA's membership qualifications. Several years ago, ADA eliminated the requirement that active member dentists be licensed; dentists are eligible for membership if they hold a D.D.S., D.M.D., or equivalent degree. The MDA Bylaws amendment would define an "equivalent" degree as "a degree that the jurisdiction involved deems sufficient to allow the degree holder to sit for a full and complete dental licensure examination for a dentist's license in the jurisdiction without any additional training". Another part of this amendment establishes a provisional membership, which may be granted for a limited period to a dentist who applies for membership but cannot be formally approved by a component society if it does not meet to do so until a later time.

Resolution 4-2018 – MDA's independent auditor recently performed a financial audit and rendered a qualified opinion because finances of component societies were not reported as a part of MDA's financial statements. While the auditor assumed component dental societies are financially integrated with MDA, they are not. The proposed amendments will not change the relationship between MDA and local district dental societies. It will, however, clarify that component dental societies are organized independently and separately from MDA. Each has its own Constitution and Bylaws; elects its officers; generally conducts business independently from MDA and manages its finances.

Resolution 5-2018 – 2018 Dues. The 2018-19 budget will be approved by the Board of Directors on May 2. The Executive Committee has proposed a placeholder dues increase of \$10, however, if the budget approved by the Board does not require a \$10 dues increase, the proposed amendment may be modified by the General Assembly or withdrawn by the Board.
