DENTURISTS SUE MONTANA BOARD OF DENTISTRY OVER IMPLANT RULE

The Denturist Association of Montana (DAM) filed a lawsuit against the Montana Board of Dentistry on December 13, 2013 alleging that the Board has violated Montana statutes prohibiting regulation in a discriminatory manner, that it has restrained trade and that it has interfered with their lawful rights.

DAM cited these statutes as the basis for suing the Board of Dentistry:

MCA 37-1-131 requires regulatory boards to "apply the standards and rules . . . in a manner that does not discriminate against any person licensed by the board with regard to how the standards and rules are applied to other persons licensed by the board and that does not restrain trade or competition unless necessary to protect public health and safety".

MCA 2-4-506 provides that "a rule may be declared invalid or inapplicable in an action for declaratory judgment if it is found that the rule or its threatened application interferes with or impairs or threatens to interfere with or impair the legal rights or privileges of the plaintiff".

DAM contends that:

The Board's rule prohibiting denturists from placing dentures over implants allegedly "constitutes a restraint of trade or competition which is not necessary to protect public health and safety, and unfairly discriminates between persons regulated by the Board who are equally capable of fitting oral prostheses over implants."

The Board allegedly "has aggressively pursued any perceived violations by denturists" of advertising laws.

The Board allegedly "has repeatedly neglected and failed to remove resolved complaints against denturists on the 'Licensee Lookup' section of the Montana Department of Labor and Industry-Business Standards Division long after complaints have been resolved."

ARM § 24.138.2302(j) provides that "fitting, attempting to fit or advertising to fit a prosthesis on or over a dental implant" is unprofessional conduct for a denturist. "Rule j" has been challenged by denturists since in adoption in 1991.

Last year Cliff Christenot, the denturist on the Board of Dentistry, made a motion that the Board repeal the rule. The Board referred this to the Board's newly-formed Denturitry Committee, comprised of Mr. Christenot, Allen Castell (the president of DAM) and Dr. Dale Chamberlain, a member of the Board. The committee recommended that the Board repeal the rule. At its September 6, 2013 meeting, the Board further discussed repealing the rule and possible amendments other than repeal. It voted to refer the rule back to the Denturitry Committee for further consideration. As no meeting of the committee was called, no further action has been taken by the Board.

Board Moves Forward to Eliminate X-Ray Rule

The Board of Dentistry voted unanimously to continue to move forward to eliminate the rule allowing dental assistants from other states to qualify to take x-rays, "if qualified in another state". Under the change, those assistants must take the DANB x-ray exam, be qualified by military experience, or be graduates of a CODA accredited assistant program. PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Dr. Mike Veseth MDA President

The MDA and the ADA are trying to make your practice less stressful and help you with questions and problems that are common to dental professionals. Looking back over twenty-five years I can say I was slow to take advantage of membership value. It was years before I gave the ADA Journal and MDA and ADA newsletters more than a brief look. That was my mistake. Don't be like me, be better.

Unlike twenty years ago there are now more avenues of communication. We are living in a communications explosion. In addition to old fashion mail, there is e-mail, Twitter, and Facebook. The telephone has been augmented by Skype. The printed journals and newspapers have been reinforced by websites.

Both the ADA and the MDA are trying to improve member value by using web sites. The MDA uses a recently built web site, with the logo "Who's my Dentist?" to promote good oral health and public information. It gives advice on preventive care, finding a dentist, affording dental care, and introducing children to good dental health practices. The MDA website also helps dentists to be informed and communicate about legislative issues.

There are both MDA and ADA websites. The ADA has a larger number and a greater variety of subjects. When you review the web site you will find non advertising information on oral health products and independent reviews of dental equipment. If you want information on dental products for patients, you should consult the ADA Product Guide. It is just a few clicks away on the internet.

I would also like to point out a new ADA web site: Success.ADA.org. This has come online in the last few months and acts as a central web site for information on the business aspects of a dental practice. Information about basic practice management problems is useful if you are a new grad or a long time dentist. There is also information on patient communication to improve patient satisfaction, and strategies to make your office more productive. There are also updates on OSHA, HIPPA, and the Affordable Care Act. Everybody has frequently asked questions on these subjects, and organized dentistry is trying to provide you with sound answers.

Your search for answers to problems shouldn't stop with the MDA and the ADA. You may want to speak with colleagues whom you can meet at a dental get together. The information provided regularly by organized dentistry is a good place to start to find answers to your problems. If you are reading this in the ADA News, congratulations you are on the right road! Keep going! There is much available, use it.




